Itinerant Music Lessons & the School Bands

We have several external music teachers who come to Waihi College to teach our students who are interested in learning an instrument (this is over and above what they learn in their rotation music class). These classes are free to our students and are offered during class time. We also have a couple of school bands—rock, concert and brass that are for all aged kids.

Some of the instruments our students learn are: Guitar, Bass, Drums, Piano, Flute, Saxophone, Trumpet, Trombone and Clarinet. We also have two school bands—one rock and one concert band, as well as students who do their own electronic music production.

Te Ara Poutama is a strong, inclusive and fierce force that Waihi College, and the whole community, is extremely proud of.









Community & Charity

Becoming a Hall Technician or Librarian


Hall Technician
