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UNIFORM POLICY

Years 7-10

Regulation Waihi College maroon polo shirt, Plain black or white long sleeved thermal top if desired (no logo, pattern or writing) Waihi College knitted jersey or Waihi College

black cotton sweatshirt Waihi College shorts, skirt (of an appropriate length*), sports track pants or long trousers

Waihi College jacket Flat, plain black shoes (any material) or flat plain black sandals (shoes must have a back strap – no slides). Plain black crocs are fine, with the back strap used, but no jibbitz/charms. Plain black or white socks (no logos) or Waihi College socks.

Years 11-12

As above except shirt: Regulation Waihi College white polo shirt (until 2025) or the new black polo shirt (from 2024)

<u>Year 13</u>

Are permitted to wear tidy mufti which is deemed acceptable by the Principal.

* Skirt length deemed appropriate by the senior management team

Accessories (for all students)

<u>Hats</u>: Waihi College caps or black hats/caps may be worn. They may have a logo of another colour, but this must not be offensive. Caps and hats should not be worn inside the classroom.

<u>Jewellery</u>: Wristwatch, studs or sleepers <u>(may have more than one set)</u>, one necklace (to be worn inside the shirt), one small ring.

Accessories: Belts, scarves etc. have to be black.

<u>Hair</u>: Must be a natural looking colour, of normal style and accepted by the Principal. Headbands, hair ties may be of any colour but must be of a plain style without bows, flowers etc.

Makeup: Subtle makeup is acceptable

<u>Piercing and Tattoos</u>: no visible facial piercing or visible tattoos (including Y13). <u>Any exemption to this needs BOT approval.</u>



PHONE POLICY

For the last few years, Waihi College has banned the use of cell phones during school time. This ban also includes items that connect to phones such as earphones (airpods), headphones and speakers.

- If a student is seen using a phone during school time (from when they walk on to school property until they leave), a staff member will request the phone be handed to them for safekeeping.
- It will then be stored in the main office for three days. It will be logged in by office staff and signed out upon return.
- The students caregiver may collect the phone at any time. However, students will undertake an after-school lesson for the early return of the phone.
- If students need their phone for after school, it must be switched off and in their bags. The school will take no responsibility for phones in bags.
- If a student has multiple incidents of phone use during school time, they will be referred to the Kaiārahi/SLT for defiance.

THE BENEFITS OF NO PHONES

- Increased positive socialisation between students during break times.
- Fewer disruptions in class.
- Increase in engaged learning time and improved academic performance.
- Reduction in cyberbullying and the sharing of offensive materials.
- Reduction of breaches of the Digital Harmful Communications Act 2015.



Cell Phones



- The use of phones is BANNED during school time.
- This **also includes** items that connect to phones such as earphones (airpods), headphones and speakers.
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- It will be stored in the main office for three days. It will be logged in by office staff and signed out upon return.
- Your caregiver may collect your phone at any time. However, students will undertake an after-school lesson for the early return of a phone.
