Our College A ladies are enjoying more competition over in Tauranga on a Thursday night.


Senior Girls Development are finding balance and improving their skills and knowledge.

### **Defensive Driving Course**

These sessions will be run on a Monday after school for 4 weeks, starting 10 June, 17 June, 24 June and the last day 1 July. Costs for the full course is \$220.00 paid to Waihi College in full by 14 June; if you prefer to pay in instalments this is available, please start these payments this week. By Completing a Defensive Driving Course, you will reduce the time you are required to spend on your re-

stricted licence by 6 months and most importantly you will learn defensive driving skills, such as assessing and identifying hazards to reduce the risk of being in a road crash.
