StudyLink Account ~ Wednesday 16th October

Students moving onto tertiary learning will need to create a StudyLink account and on this day we will have support to help you with this. There are a number of ways StudyLink can help pay for your study: compulsory course fees, course-related costs (eg books, laptop,etc), day-to-day living costs and other related costs to your learning.

To create your StudyLink account you will need to bring:

- \Rightarrow A RealMe Verified Login Account (details above)
- \Rightarrow Take the eligibility test
- \Rightarrow Course details, including costs
- ⇒ Your weekly income, including any benefit you expect to get whilst studying; if you are unsure you may put \$0 but make sure to update this when you know
- ⇒ Your Parents contact details, your relationship to them, whether they live together or not, their combined annual income (IRD income summary is the easiest proof of this, they can login through their MyIR to find this info) and whether they are supporting other full-time students aged 16-24.
- \Rightarrow Your New Zealand IRD Number
- \Rightarrow Your tax code
- \Rightarrow Your New Zealand Bank Account details
- \Rightarrow An alternative contact person and their details

- 9 hours of learning time in total held over four 2 hour group sessions onsite at school. All 4 sessions must be attended, in sequence with active participation to pass.
- An individual driver assessment with your course facilitator and professional driving instructor, Gavin from Thames Driver Training will be done once you have completed the required group sessions.
- Your AA Defensive Driving Course Certificate is awarded upon attending all 4 sessions and completing your in-car assessment. 6 months will be taken off your Restricted Licence mandatory time, you will be driving independently sooner and safer.

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Preparing for your learner licence test

Thinking about getting your learner licence? Here are some tips and information for preparing.

To get a learner licence, you must:

be at least 16 years old


be able to correctly answer 32 out of 35 questions on the road code

- One of the ways to prepare for the learner licence test is by working your way through Drive's Road Code. https://drive.govt.nz/learner-licence or use the QR below.

- Drives Road Code contains chapter tests at the end of each section. These are like mini practice tests and a great way to check you're on the right track.

- Complete all the chapter tests and you get access to their official practice test. If you're consistently getting every answer correct in the practice test, that's a good sign you're ready for the real thing.

- Otherwise the Road Code or an app are popular with students, details below.



Learners Licence test:

Each Road Code Practice Test has 35 questions - for a car license you must get 32 out of 35 to pass. Each practice test of 35 questions is randomly generated from all the test questions found in the official NZ Road Code.

Some of our school programs and workshops are able to fully fund Learners License applications, but if you go privately to do your test expect these fees: As of 8 July fees have changed. Your second attempt is covered in the application fee if needed, but attempts after these will each have a fee.

Car (class 1)	Application fee (includes 2 tests)	Test fee for each test from 3rd attempt
Learner	\$96.10	\$54.60

The key for success, is to practice, practice, practice. Good luck.

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
