



27 January to 20 February 2026. 9.00am – 3.30pm daily

You can take your first University paper and get set-up for the rest of your studies, find your way around campus, and make friends all before the end of summer. There are a number of 100-level (15 point) papers you can choose from on the Hamilton Campus and Tauranga Campus, and we offer one online paper for those who are unable to attend in person.

Jump Start is particularly good for those who need a boost in areas such as literacy, maths, and science and those who have been out of study for a while. This program is also great for those who would like to make friends and ease into understanding the University environment and learn valuable study skills.

University of Waikato announce the NZ Graduate School of Medicine!

This is a landmark day for the University and for New Zealand. It will be the country's first graduate-entry medical school and the first medical school to open its doors in New Zealand in 60 years.

Our medical school will take a fundamentally different approach to training doctors in New Zealand and will complement the two existing medical schools.

We will deliver a programme that attracts more people who want to train to be doctors in primary and community care, which will mean more graduates who then choose to become GPs, particularly in regional and rural communities. The four-year programme will open in 2028 with an initial cohort of 120 students.




The NZGSM will take an innovative and community-engaged approach to addressing the chronic workforce shortages in primary care – training the doctors our country needs. The programme will prioritise clinical placements in regional and rural health settings, allowing graduates to experience working with diverse populations while building deep connections in the communities they serve.

Entry Requirements

All applicants must be a minimum of 18 years of age at course commencement. All applicants undertake a detailed course discussion with a member of the academic team.

Academic Requirements:

NCEA Level 2 including:

- 48 Level 2 (or higher) credits over four QRC approved subjects
- Numeracy: 10 Level 1 (or higher) numeracy credits
- Literacy: 4 Reading and 4 Writing Literacy credits.

Mature Students (20 years +)

Applicants not meeting the entry criteria may be considered on a case by case basis by the Head of School. Consideration will be given to those with appropriate and evidenced previous academic history, prior work experience and life skills experience.

Recognition of Prior Learning

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) can be granted when prior study or work experience is judged to be equivalent to all learning outcomes for a particular QRC paper.



- ✓ Apply for University of Auckland accommodation and submit it by 13 August
