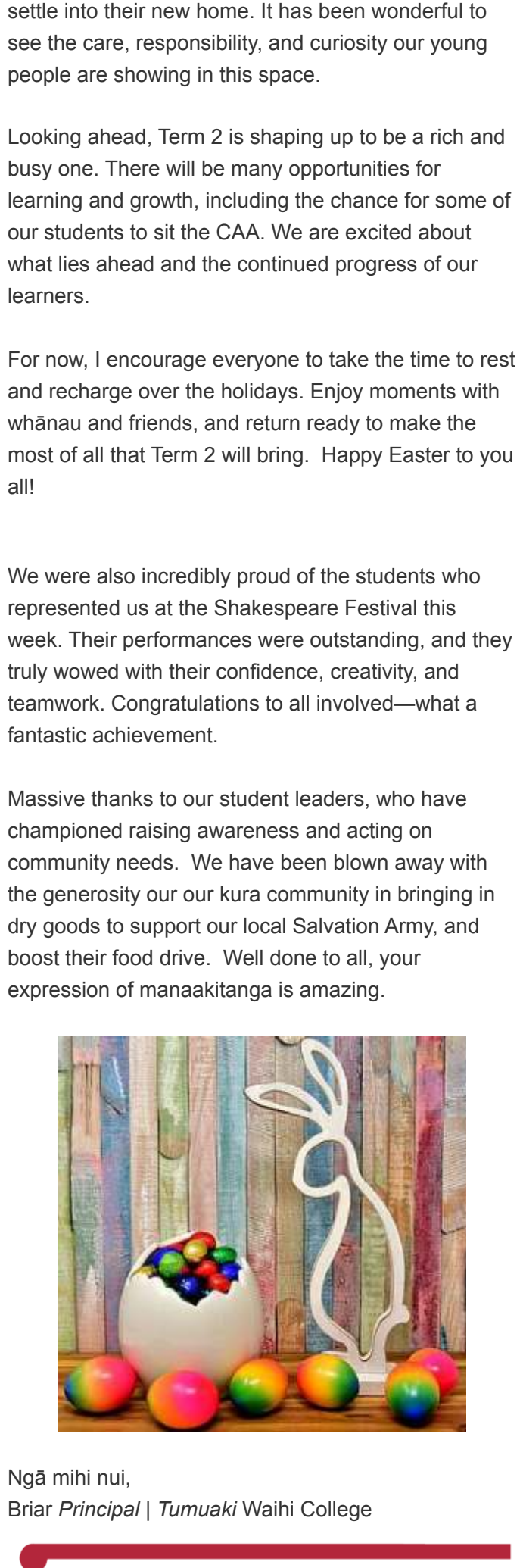

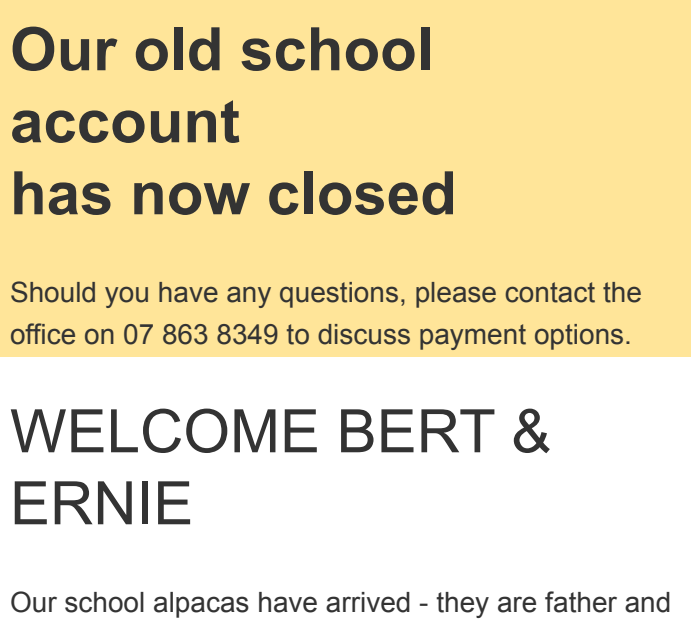

A Community Effort to Be Proud Of

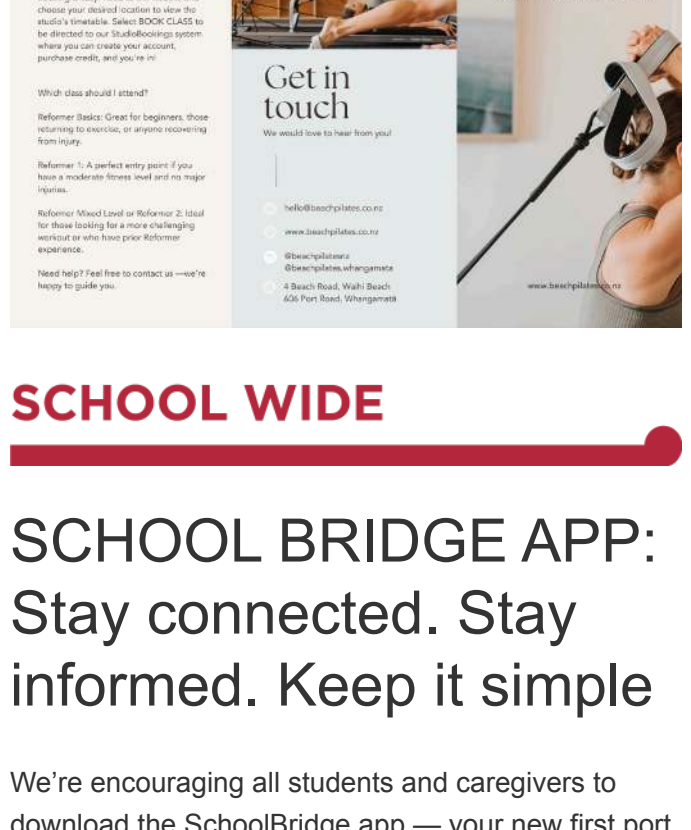

This initiative is a wonderful example of the care and compassion that sits at the heart of our school. It's about looking out for one another and stepping up when it matters most.

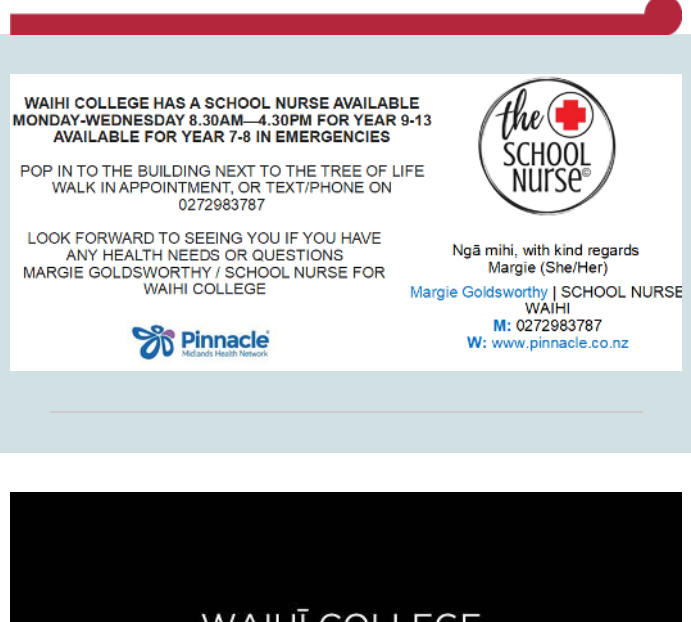
